2024 Climate Charter targets

With a focus on climate justice and human rights, addressing the humanitarian impacts of the climate crisis and enhancing the resilience of vulnerable people to climate-induced shocks is central to Mission East's vision and mission, and forms a key part of our 2030 strategy.

In September 2023, we updated our greening policy, which will be rolled out across the organisation in 2024. The policy has three main priorities:

- Mission East will increase our response to the growing humanitarian needs arising from the climate and environment crisis, promoting locally led and evidence-based solutions
- Mission East will invest in measures to reduce our organisational footprint and will apply high environmental standards across all areas of operation
- Mission East will invest in improving the greening skills of its staff and local partners, and will actively engage and sensitise our supporters to the climate and environment crisis

For our work in 2024, we have set ourselves the following over-arching targets:

- Mission East will have rolled out its recently revised greening policy, integrating guidance and approaches into relevant policies and programme implementation
- Mission East will make use of forecast-based analysis & climate vulnerability assessment tools
- Mission East will have set an emissions reductions target with a plan for how to achieve reductions across the organisation and its projects
