

Mission East's Climate Charter Commitments and Progress

With a focus on climate justice and human rights, addressing the humanitarian impacts of the climate crisis and enhancing the resilience of vulnerable people to climate-induced shocks remains central to Mission East's vision and mission. This commitment is embedded in our 2030 strategy and guides our operational and programmatic priorities.

2024 Progress update: In September 2023, we updated our Greening Policy, which began rolling out across the organisation in 2024. The policy outlines our ambition to become an even more environmentally responsible and climate-aware organisation, while ensuring that our humanitarian response is inclusive, locally led, and evidence-based.

The Greening Policy has three main priorities:

- Responding to climate and environmental crises: Mission East will increase its
 response to the growing humanitarian needs arising from the climate and
 environment crisis, promoting locally led and evidence-based solutions.
- Reducing our organisational footprint: We will invest in measures to reduce our environmental impact and apply high environmental standards across all areas of operation.
- Building capacity and awareness: We will strengthen the greening skills of our staff
 and local partners, and actively engage and sensitise our supporters to the climate and
 environment crisis.

2025 progress update:

- We have set ourselves a 45% emissions reduction target by 2030, reflecting our ambition to significantly reduce our organisational footprint in line with global climate goals.
- We are pursuing offsetting measures which support humanitarian needs and community resilience to complement our reduction efforts, recognising the urgency of immediate climate action while we transition to lower emissions.
- We have undertaken targeted research on the vulnerabilities faced by persons with disabilities in the context of the climate crisis, ensuring our programming is inclusive and responsive to those most at risk.
- We continue to explore and adopt new tools and methodologies to strengthen our work.
